They are either going to skip on cleaning and preparation (the most important part of the job), use overly diluted pavement sealer or is not running a legitimate business and is most likely uninsured/underinsured or paying their employees under the table. Keep in mind that workers on a "cash payroll" are not covered by workman's compensation insurance. If your project is for a residential driveway- most homeowners insurance policies have exclusions for covering uninsured workers that are injured on your property. If the injured worker decides to sue you; your home and assets could be at risk.
